ERA marked 2nd-lowest by NL reliever, while workload established St. Louis single-season mark by any hurler... 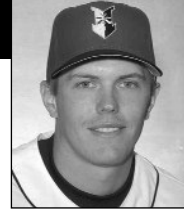

Signed by Oaxaca (MEX), December 17, 2002... Signed by San Diego Padres as a minor league free agent, March 18, 2003... Traded outright to Mexico City, March 27, 2003... Traded outright from Mexico City to Los Angeles Dodgers, May 9, 2005... Signed by Padres as a minor league free agent, February 21, 2007... **PERSONAL:** Married, wife's name is Elena, daughter Emely and son Oscar... graduated from Montgomery High School in San Diego, where he set a then-record for San Diego Section career hits (143)... **CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Made his ML debut on May 10, 2005, Mother's Day in Mexico... The date was especially meaningful because he had made a promise to his mother before she passed away in 1997 that he would play in the Major Leagues... Became the 98th Mexican-born player to see Major League action... **2007:** Played 28 games with Triple-A Portland and hit .284 (29-for-102) with five doubles, three triples, 11 RBI, nine runs scored and eight walks... Played in 24 games with San Diego, batting .231 (6-for-26) with two RBI and two walks... also notched five sacrifice hits... appeared in eight games at second base, including two starts... also made four appearances at third base... committed no errors in 24 total chances... notched a pinch-hit single 9/29 at Milwaukee... placed on Padres 15-day disabled list, August 31 due to a left wrist tendon sheath tear... **2006:** Appeared in 29 games for the Dodgers and hit .152 (5-for-33) with a triple... recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas on 4/17 where he was hitting .250 with five RBI at the time of his promotion... options back to Las Vegas on 5/9 for just two days before being recalled on 5/12... batted .167 (2-for-12) in his second stint with the Big League club before being options to Las Vegas for the third time on 5/30... finished the season at Las Vegas, hitting .287 (79-for-275) with 28 RBI in 86 total games with the 51s... was recalled by LAD on 9/5 and finished the season on the big league roster... **2005:** Contract purchased by Los Angeles Dodgers from Mexico City Red Devils on 5/9 and remained with the Major League club for the remainder of the season... 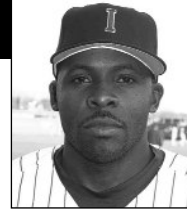
